1. 2 Corinthians 5:7	What uncertainties do you have? Ask God to guide you over these perceived obstacles.
2. 1 Timothy 4:8	Why is godliness and overall spiritual health essential for support raising?
3. Exodus 25:1–40; Exodus 35:21–29	How is true, biblical fundraising a part of your spiritual ministry, not just a means to do ministry?
4. James 1:2–4	What trials have you already faced in support raising? How have they been beneficial for your long journey?
5. 1 Timothy 6:6–12; Hebrews 13:5	Are you being budget-driven or vision-driven? How does “poor talk” dishonor God?
6. Proverbs 19:21	Have you put God in the driver’s seat or are you still trying to steer?
7. Matthew 5:43–48	It’s likely that you will face opposition in your support raising. How can you prepare for those experiences so that you respond in godliness?
8. Romans 11:33–36; Philippians 4:19	List the areas where you’ve seen God provide beyond expectations.
9. 2 Timothy 1:8–12	Having a hard day? You can count on them when you are doing the Lord’s work. Buckle up!
10. Acts 20:35; Matthew 10:8	Why does Jesus say it is more blessed to give than to receive?
11. Ecclesiastes 4:9–12	Have you recruited teammates or a steering committee to help in support raising?
12. Luke 8–10	How did Jesus and his disciples live and minister on support?
13. Numbers 13:30–33	How does God view you as a support raiser? Why is it important to think of yourself as God does?
14. Proverbs 20:4; Psalm 5:3	Preparation and planning is key in support raising. Are you striving to diligently maintain a schedule?
15. Philippians 4:6–7	Make all of your requests known to God. What are you not asking God for ... that you should be?
16. Colossians 3:23–24	Why and how will God honor your hard work?
17. Ephesians 4:31–32	How do you deal with no’s? Why should they be viewed as opportunities?
18. James 5:16	How is having a team of prayer partners as beneficial as a team of financial partners? Who can you ask today to pray for you?
19. Psalm 46:10	Be still before the Lord. What is He telling you? What is He asking you to join Him in?
20. Proverbs 4:23	What areas of your heart do you need to guard to keep you from falling into sin?
21. James 1:5–8	Ask God before asking God’s people. Why is this the best course of action when approaching potential donors?
22. Proverbs 22:7; Psalm 37:21	Do you have any debt? Pray over any current debt and against future debt.
23. Philippians 1:3–11	What kind of relationship did Paul have with his supporters? Lift up your supporters in prayer individually.
24. 1 Corinthians 9:13–14	Why did God call you into this ministry? How does that give you confidence in support raising?

25. 2 Corinthians 9:5–15	List the results of being generous. Are you a cheerful giver?
26. 2 Corinthians 4:2; Ezra 7:10	Why is being spiritually healthy an essential foundation before beginning to raise support?
27. John 15:5	Ask the Lord to fill you with His Spirit and words today.
28. Matthew 19:26	How are you going to deal with discouragement?
29. James 4:6; 1 John 2:16	Is pride a stumbling block for you? If so, how?
30. Isaiah 40:28–31	Pray for renewed strength and energy in support raising.
31. 1 Corinthians 9:15–18	What is your motivation for going into full-time Christian work? What are you trying to accomplish?
32. Isaiah 55:8–9	Pray for a divine appointment today. Allow the Lord to speak to you!
